

NOTEFLIGHT UPDATE



Marie and Sarah attended the July 16 workshop at Champlain College for learning more about Noteflight Learning Edition and how it works together with Haiku LMS.

Noteflight Learning Edition makes it easy for teachers to publish and share musical teaching materials with students, and for students to share their work with teachers. NLE uses Noteflight Crescendo, which is a full-featured notation editor which lets students create, edit, hear and print music in any standard Web browser. Haiku LMS is a learning management system that provides a framework for building online courses and managing class rosters. NLE members can freely create and share musical scores and

resources of all kinds using these cloud-based programs. At the workshop, getting more accustomed to the software, with in-person training, went beyond "helpful" all the way to inspiring. Putting a learning activity "on the cloud" is relatively easy, so our teaching skills can fully focus on the content. It was also fun and instructive to hear what the other workshop participants, most of whom were college or public school teachers, were doing with these programs.

In June, the VMTA Board voted to subscribe to NLE for two years starting this summer. It will be fun for our teachers to share with each other and work together to develop online learning activities. Also, it will actively engage our students in learning and making their own music. It would be great to gather again and get more familiar with these programs - the more of us who try it and use it, the more fun and the better resource it can be for all of us.

Does this arouse your curiosity? If you want to begin exploring this new resource, just contact Sandi or Sarah or Marie to get the login, password, and URL. The only rule is to MAKE A COPY of any score before you change it for your own use. (If you change the template, those changes "stick" for everyone who opens it after you.) Tech support is available as noted in the programs.

Once we have a core group of teachers and students who have begun to use Noteflight Learning Edition, our Vermont Music Teachers Association will have a program to entice new members to join as well as energize our current members. Don't miss our upcoming Noteflight workshop at our Fall Convention.

Vermont Music Teachers State Conference September 22, 2012 Jane Magrath, clinician

9:00 – 10:15 Fresh Classics: Motivating Students while Finding Meaning

Invigorating classics to motivate students will be presented along with teaching suggestions that can be applied to much of the classical teaching literature. The focus is on teaching to find the meaning in the music for both student and audience.

10:30 - 11:45 Motivation in Piano Study and Performance

A look at the subject of motivation, and thoughts surrounding areas the music teacher can consider, especially with respect to how to give feedback, perils of over-praising, and approaches for ways to offer criticism. Subtopics include competency and motivation, mindsets, giving feedback, what the research shows, and summary and the importance of fun. Video segments illuminate the discussion.

Lunch

1:00 – 2:15 Classical Piano Teaching Literature: Outside the Box

Rethink your teaching selections to include crisp and fresh goal pieces and motivating repertoire groupings to invigorate. Various classical piano works for the intermediate and advancing piano student will be presented by level. The purpose is to enliven the way a teacher thinks about literature for a student – to help keep that student fresh, surprised, and motivated. Videos of student performances will augment the presentation.

2:30 - 3:15 Practice Techniques for the Elementary Pianist

Typical teaching pieces from the standard classical literature are assessed in terms of practice techniques for today's hurried child. A practice formula is established for the student to follow in his quest to learn a new work.

3:30-5:00 Music-COMP Presentation presented by Sandi MacLeod

New tools for teachers and students. Come explore the new online program for VMTA members that will allow you to create lessons based on music theory, history or composition. Your students can access these at home on the computer and create their own original music to share with you and others in a notation editor. For the next year, this program is being provided free to interested VMTA members. Laptops are encouraged for hands-on exploration, but observers are welcome too.

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Jane Magrath is well known as an author, clinician, and pianist. Her book, <u>The Pianist's Guide to</u> <u>Standard Teaching and Performance Literature</u>, has become a classic reference work for pianists throughout the country, and Magrath's work in the area of the standard classical teaching literature has been central to the current revival of interest in this music throughout the U.S. She currently has more than thirty-five volumes published with Alfred Publishing, and her music editions are used widely throughout the U.S. and abroad. Her classical series include the *Masterwork Classics* series in

9 volumes, Encore, Masterpieces with Flair, Melodious Masterpieces, Sonatina Masterworks, Modern Masterworks, and the Classics Alive series. Her newest literature series is titled Audition Repertoire for the Advancing Pianist.

Dr. Magrath is frequently in demand as a clinician and teacher, and during the last twenty years has performed and given presentations in over forty states including Alaska, and on three continents. Her workshops and master classes have drawn international acclaim. Magrath has served as Piano Coordinator for National Conventions of Music Teachers National Association and given presentations at MTNA National Conventions, the European Piano Teachers Association Conference, the National Conference on Piano Pedagogy, the World Piano Pedagogy Conference and at many state MTNA conventions. Her articles have appeared in the major piano journals. She was named the first recipient of the MTNA / Frances Clark Keyboard Pedagogy Award for the Outstanding Contribution to Piano Pedagogy. For many years she contributed New Music Reviews to Clavier and the column *Polyphony*, to *The American Music Teacher* and continues her column *Musings through Clavier Companion*. Magrath currently serves as an editor for the *Piano Pedagogy Forum*.

A native of South Carolina, Magrath received her education at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and at Wesleyan College, and was the first person to receive the D.M. in Piano Performance and Pedagogy from Northwestern University. A faculty member at the University of Oklahoma since 1981, she received a Regents' Award for Superior Teaching as



well as an Associates' Distinguished Lectureship Award on two occasions and a Rinsland Award for Excellence in Educational Research. She was named McCasland Presidential Professor by the University, Oklahoma Music Teachers Association Teacher of the Year by that association, and also Oklahoma Musician of the Year by the Oklahoma Federation of Music Clubs. Currently, Magrath is Regents' Professor and holds the Grant Endowed Chair in Piano Pedagogy at the University of Oklahoma, where she was recently named Rothbaum Presidential Professor of Excellence in the Arts and serves as Director of Piano Pedagogy. In 2009, she received the Neustadt Award from the University, given to an advocate for students and nominated by students. She advises masters and doctoral students in the piano pedagogy degree, and has chaired many documents and dissertations in the department. Her students have won numerous prizes and competitions. Magrath is most at home working in the studio and classroom with students, and collaborating with faculty colleagues, pianists, and teachers.



Sandi MacLeod, Ed.D. is the Executive Director of Music-COMP (formerly the Vermont MIDI Project) and was a founding member of the group established in 1995. This nationally acclaimed program promoting music composition includes over 6,000 students each year in over 50 Vermont schools as well as schools in Virginia, New York, Connecticut and Indiana. Student composers connect with professional composers for online mentoring. The project promotes live performance of original student works in multiple venues.


